## How to find us

### By train

Winnersh (at Winnersh Crossroads) - ¼ mile.  
Turn right out of the station and follow walking directions below.

### By bus

From Reading, take the 191 to Winnersh Crossroads (junction Reading Road, Robin Hood Lane and King Street Lane), Texaco garage on right, Sainsbury's on left. Follow walking directions below.

### Walking from Winnersh Crossroads

Walk down King Street Lane and at Sindlesham Village Green go straight on at the mini roundabout. You will see the sign for Berkshire Masonic Centre and Lord Harris Court. The Home lies within the same gates as Berkshire Masonic Centre on the right-hand side just past Mayfields.

### By car

From the M4. Leave the M4 at Junction 10, then join the A329(M) (signposted Reading). Take the first exit of A329M (signposted Winnersh, Woodley). At the roundabout, take the second exit. At the next roundabout, take the first exit (signposted Winnersh, Earley).

At traffic signals continue straight on, through the roundabout. Continue forward onto Lower Earley Way North - B3270. At the roundabout, take the first exit onto Mole Road. Take the first turning on your left. The Home lies within the same gates as the Berkshire Masonic Centre. Once through the gates the Home is on your right hand side.

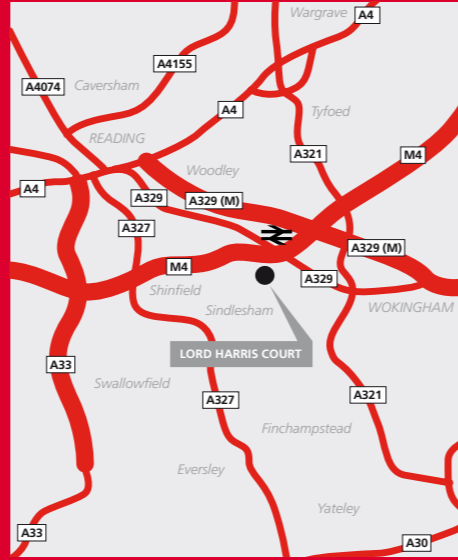

Purpose built in 1972, Lord Harris Court is set in spacious grounds in the village of Sindlesham, next to the Berkshire Masonic Centre.

Within the grounds, residents can enjoy the delights of the central garden, known as the Chapel garden, a tranquil and sheltered place where many of the plants are chosen for their scent and birds are encouraged to nest. The gardens are laid out for the enjoyment of the residents, with lawns, an orchard and comfortable seating.

Lord Harris Court has the dual benefits of individual rooms and shared communal areas. The categories of care offered are dependent upon people's assessed individual needs.

Here is a snapshot of our services at Lord Harris Court:

### General facilities and services available

The whole premise of the RMBI is to create a home rather than an 'institutional style' environment, both inside and out. Lord Harris Court can accommodate 90 residents offering residential and nursing care.

All of our homes can offer places to people with dementia, following an assessment of their needs.

All rooms are centrally heated, furnished bed-sitting rooms with ensuite washbasin and toilet. Some bedrooms have the benefit of ensuite showers. Residents may furnish their own rooms with small items of furniture, if they wish, provided that the furniture meets the required safety standards. Satellite/Cable tv is available at residents own cost and by arrangement.

On each corridor there are bath/shower facilities especially adapted for safe usage so that residents maintain their independence

### Health and personal care

Lord Harris Court offers a wide range of recreational facilities including a well stocked library with a full range of books to suit many needs.

A full programme of activities is organised by our Activities Co-ordinators and includes keep fit classes, theatre and music groups and day trips.

The Home has its own hairdressing salon where residents can enjoy haircuts and pampering from a professional hairdresser.

Meals are served in the main dining room, although residents may occasionally take meals in their rooms. If residents have special dietary requirements, these can also be met. Residents' family and friends are also encouraged to dine – at a small charge.
