Elmstead Wood - 4 miles

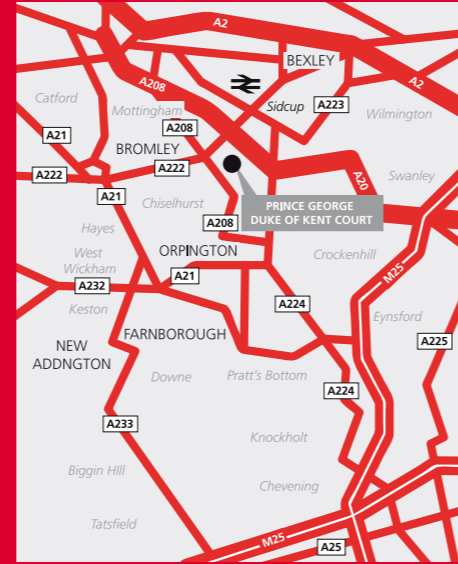
By car

Prince George Duke of Kent Court



Purpose-built in 1968, Prince George Duke of Kent Court is situated in a beautiful area of Kent. The Home is surrounded by gardens containing a large collection of rose bushes as well as many shrubs, providing pleasant areas to sit and relax. A concrete path borders the garden, allowing residents with frames or wheelchairs to have unrestricted access.

The Home has the dual benefit of individual rooms and shared communal areas. The categories of care offered are dependent upon people's assessed individual needs.

Here is a snapshot of our services at Prince George Duke of Kent Court:

General facilities and services available

The whole premise of the RMBI is to create a home rather than an 'institutional style' environment, both inside and out. Prince George Duke of Kent Court can accommodate up to 78 residents offering both residential and nursing care. All rooms are centrally heated, furnished bed-sitting rooms, some with ensuite facilities. Residents may furnish their own rooms with small items of furniture if they wish, provided that the furniture meets the required safety standards.

On each corridor there are bath/shower facilities especially adapted for safe usage so that residents maintain their independence in a safe environment. Kitchenettes are available where residents can make drinks and snacks for themselves or their visitors.

Health and personal care

Prince George Duke of Kent Court offers a wide range of recreational facilities including a fully stocked library with a full range of books to suit many needs. Social and other activities are an important aspect of the care at the Home. Residents are encouraged to remain active for as long as they are able. A full programme of activities is organised by our Activities Co-ordinator to include arts and crafts, entertainment, events and visits to various places of interest.

The Home has its own hairdressing salon where residents can enjoy haircuts and pampering from a professional hairdresser.

Meals are served in the main dining room although residents can have meals in their rooms if they prefer. If residents have special dietary requirements, these can also be met. Residents' family and friends are also encouraged to dine – at a small charge.
