# Our philosophy of care

Zetland Court is operated and managed by the Royal Masonic Benevolent Institution Care Company (RMBI Care Co). It is also regulated by the Care Quality Commission.

Caring is our way of life. As an organisation, our values are: Personal, Professional, Supportive, Learning, Respectful and above all, Kind. We aim to live by these values, and this is shown throughout our work and how we treat others.

We use a person centred approach to care for and support people. This means looking at the world from their point of view, ‘standing in their place’ and appreciating how they might be feeling.

# Types of care

Making the decision to move into a care home can be difficult - that's why we're here to support you every step of the way.

## Dementia support

Zetland Court offers residential and nursing care for up to 45 people and dementia support for up to 18 people.

We believe that people living with dementia can still lead an active and fulfilled life. Our staff are trained to deliver support that is individual to each person, so that you can continue to live meaningfully.

The 'Butterfly Service' status is a prestigious nationally recognised kitemark, awarded by Dementia Care Matters, a leading dementia

care organisation. It recognises care homes that are committed to delivering excellent dementia services. As an organisation, we are working closely with them to ensure we always deliver the highest standards of dementia care.

## Residential care

Residential care is provided for people who can no longer continue to live at home, even with support from home care services. It can help people to live safely, whilst giving family members peace of mind, knowing that you are in a supportive environment.



## Nursing care

Our nurses are trained to deliver a more specialist level of support which promotes health and wellbeing. This type of care is for anyone who requires 24 hours support from a registered nurse.

## Short stay and respite care

Short stay breaks, including respite care, are available to people who are cared for in their own homes. They allow families or carers to have a rest from taking care of a loved one.

This can be a good option to recover after a hospital stay, or to experience what life is like at our care home.

## Palliative care

Caring for someone during the final days of their life requires specialist skills and understanding. We are committed to making sure that our end of life care respects and upholds a person's dignity and we are here to support you throughout this difficult time.
